We are the intellectual property counsel for Rouchon Industries, Inc. d/b/a Swiftech. Your letter dated June 5, 2013 was forwarded to us.

We have begun investigating your client's infringement claims concerning Swiftech's H220 product. Preliminarily, our client does not believe the H220 product infringes any valid claim of the '764 or '362 patents. We will of course continue to review your allegations of infringement as well as the questionable validity and/or enforceability of your client's patents.

Nonetheless, in an effort to resolve this dispute without burdensome and unnecessary litigation, our client wishes to know if Asetek is willing to offer a nonexclusive license for the asserted patents to settle this dispute.
